What is an Annual?

Typically, annuals are plants that are not hardy in your plant hardiness zone. They typically complete their life cycle in the growing season from seed to germination and from blooming to seed production. So you need to plant them "annually".

Why Use Annuals?

With annuals, you can change out the color and styles of your garden seasonally. Annuals will give your landscape impact and a show that not many other plants can give and definitely one of the longest impacts of any plant.

Sun vs. Shade

There are great annuals for sun and shade. Here is a list of some of our favorites:

Sun -

- Petunias
- **Begonias**
- Lantana
- Marigolds
- Zinnas
- Geraniums

Shade -

- **Impatiens**
- Coleus
- Caladiums

Sizing Up Your Landscape

Different annuals grow at different rates. Some are more ground-cover growers while others can get 3-4 feet tall. Knowing how to space out your beds is a great start to planting a full landscape of annual color.

Growth Rate -

Make sure you are checking the labels on your plant's pots to ensure you are giving enough space for them to grow throughout the season.

Layering -

Give your beds some depth with layering in annuals by size and color. Creating a tiered system of your shortest annuals in the front to the tallest in the back will give your landscape a more polished look.

Ways to Create Impact -

The biggest pro to planting annuals in your landscape is the intense color you can add to your beds with just one day of work. There are different effects that you can create with various planting methods such as working within a color scheme, adding annuals just to the bed boarders, or creating a desired pattern through blocks of color.
