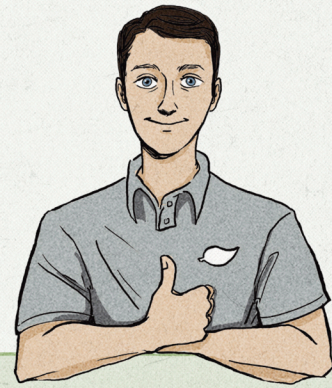

PLANT OF THE MONTH — mandevilla —



Shrubs: Looking for lots of summer blooms? Add hydrangeas for shade and roses for sunny spaces to your collection. You'll find some of the best selections this month.



Lawns: If you have St. Augustine grass or Zoysia grass lawns, now is a great time to apply Ferti-lome St. Augustine Weed & Feed to help keep weeds away and give your lawn the boost it needs.



Pruning: Deadheading annuals and perennials will help keep them blooming again and again. Take a little time to check your flowering plants to see if they need a cleanup.

Veggies: Keep veggies healthy with consistent watering and feeding. If rain is scarce, water about an inch per week to help prevent tomato splitting, and feed every 4–6 weeks with Garden-tone or Tomato-tone to support growth and blooms.



Hibiscus: There are three types of hibiscus: tropical hibiscus (annual) with vibrant summer blooms, perennial hibiscus with dinner-plate-sized flowers, and shrub hibiscus (althea or Rose of Sharon) with smaller blooms that flower all season.
